

Company eyes Scranton office for people looking to enter marijuana program

Once Pennsylvania approves doctors to see patients seeking medical marijuana, Compassionate Certification Centers will be ready to open up franchise-like offices, including one in Scranton, to get people into the state program.

Dr. Bryan Doner, co-founder of the <u>company</u>, said he anticipates having between 20 and 25 locations statewide within the next year and a half.

"It's very similar to an urgent care center. They function similar to any outpatient healthcare clinic," said Doner Friday.

The state is in the process of registering doctors to participate in its <u>program</u> and certify people to receive medical marijuana grown, processed and dispensed by licensed facilities beginning early next year.

"I'm going to be one of them," said Doner. He said he will be working at a few of the company's offices in the Pittsburgh area.

The company will attempt to staff its offices with local doctors from a broad range of specialties, said Doner.

Doner, 41, who practices emergency medicine in the greater Pittsburgh area, said the Scranton office is in the works and, depending upon supply and demand, the company would be interested in another office in Wilkes-Barre. The department issued permits for 27 dispensaries and 12 growing and processing operations statewide, including Lackawanna and Luzerne counties.

The doctors must undergo training in order to be participate, and they'll be listed in a state registry under the law that Gov. Tom Wolf signed on April 17, 2016.

As Pennsylvania's medical marijuana program gets closer to full implementation, what it's going to look like here is becoming clearer.

The law will allow those with specific medical conditions who are certified by a participating doctor to access some forms of medical marijuana, including pills, oils, vapor and liquid. That's expected to happen in the next five months.




Physician participation will be crucial if Pennsylvania's new program is going to work for patients.

Stephen Arch, a 60-year-old filmmaker from Moon Township, is prescribed the drug Klonopin for his Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, which he said stems from childhood trauma.


He said it helps keep him calm, but because he takes it on an as-needed basis, he sometimes runs out before he can refill his prescription. Because the drug is a benzodiazepine, it can lead to physical and psychological dependence. Arch said when he doesn't take Klonopin, he experiences withdrawal symptoms.

"I get almost flu-like symptoms, very high levels of anxiety and I can't sleep at night," said Arch.

He said hopes that medical marijuana will provide similar anti-anxiety benefits without the harsh effects, but that neither his primary care physician nor his psychiatrist are willing to help him get it.

PA Safe Access, a non-profit organization dedicated to fighting for medical cannabis lobbying and education in Pennsylvania, will hold a medical marijuana information session Thursday, January 18 at the State College Municipal Building from 6-8 p.m.

Earlier today, Ryan Briggs became one of the first Pennsylvanians to be certified as part of the state's new medical marijuana program. Together with his mother Diana Briggs, he and other members of his family travelled from Westmoreland County to the Compassionate Certification office in Downtown Pittsburgh where Ryan Briggs received his certification this morning.

"We started our journey four years ago with Ryan and when we started the journey, Ryan was seeing 400 seizures today," Diana Briggs said at the event.

After their appointment, the family travelled to Monroeville for a celebration of sorts. Today marked the groundbreaking of The Healing Center, a Southwestern Pennsylvania medicalcannabis dispensary.

"What we do today will help tens of thousands of people," said Pennsylvania Sen. Jim Brewster (D-McKeesport). "I was a late comer to this, but then I met the Briggs family."

Ryan Briggs has been living with intractable epilepsy, a seizure disorder, for his entire life. His family turned to medical cannabis to reduce the frequency of his seizures. They received a Safe Harbor Certificate, eligible to individuals under the age of 18 who suffer from one of the seventeen serious medical conditions defined in the Medical Marijuana

With medical marijuana now legal, Carol Cricks, who's had four hip surgeries and is in constant pain,







a conversation about their past treatment options.

"We will go through their medical records, review what they've taken and determine if they're a good candidate to receive medical marijuana," she said.

Dr. Anand said she is most excited to offer an alternate method of pain treatment to the residents of Butler County.

This is Dr. Anand's first venture into the field of medical marijuana but through her specialty of physical medicine and rehab, she says she's always looking for safer alternative for pain management, especially due to the ongoing opioid epidemic.

"I do a lot of work with MS patients, ALS patients, stroke patients and a lot of chronic pain management," she said. "Through my profession, we are always trying to figure out safer alternatives for pain control."





We are just a nanosecond into the New Year, and the cannabis industry is seeing some monumental changes.

Attorney General, Jeff Sessions, has declared a war on cannabis, and Vermont has defiantly responded by becoming the first state to legalize marijuana via the legislature as opposed to a ballot initiative. New Hampshire and New York are following closely on its heels. Cannabis stocks did take a tumble following the Sessions announcement that he would repeal the Cole Memo, but are expected to see strong gains in 2018, modeling Canadian cannabis stocks which gained an estimated 250% as a group in 2017.

Marijuana movers and shakers are making tremendous gains towards stabilizing an industry that has been on the brink for close to a decade. In fact, 2018 may very well go down in history as a cannabis coming of age.

8 Former NFL Players Share Their Thoughts on Cannabis

'm meeting up with a huge—massive, actually—former National Football League player. He's smiling, clearly doing fine, not in acute pain. We're here to talk about weed, maybe even share a joint. "Thanks for meeting me," he says. "We really need to get this story out there. The best way to get things done is through a collaborative effort."

This footballer's story goes something like this: At one point during his career, he suffered a serious injury that required surgery. His coach wanted him to get back on the field as soon as possible, so he opted for a shorter rehabilitation period than the one recommended. He asked his doctor for strong painkillers to deal with the "discomfort."

"Strong painkillers," of course, is a synonym for prescription opioids, which are now at the center of a national health crisis. Opioids do help curb pain, but relief comes at a high cost. They're addictive and have side effects that range from vomiting to respiratory depression. They also take between 15,000 and 20,000 American lives
